DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES

Aug 5 <u>Sherrill Park</u> (Richardson) 972-234-1416; 2001 E. Lookout Dr. Drive the George Bush Turnpike east of Central Expy. Exit at Jupiter; turn south for approx. 1 mile. Right turn at E. Lookout Drive, golf course straight ahead.

Aug 12 <u>The Tribute</u> (The Colony) 972-370-5465; 1000 Lebanon Rd. From Hwy 121 (Sam Rayburn Tollway) and Josey Ln./Main St./Hwy 423 drive north (through The Colony) for 4.1 miles. Observe cones and construction for the entire 4.1 miles. At Lebanon (stop light, Walgreens on left) turn left. Drive 3 miles through residential area (pass the Old American Golf Club on the left). At Dead End, turn right into The Tribute parking lot.

Aug 17 <u>Hackberry Creek C.C.</u> (Irving) 972-869-2631; 1901 W. Royal Ln. Drive the George Bush Turnpike (west/south). Take the 1st exit after passing over I-635 LBJ Frwy (Royal Lane/Hwy 114/Gateway Dr.) After exiting, make a quick right turn onto the street just prior to the new building (Texas Center for Proton Therapy). Turn right and follow the road to the stop sign, then turn right again. Drive .2 mile, course entrance on right.

Aug 19 <u>WestRidge</u> (McKinney) 972-346-2212; 9055 Cotton Ridge Road North. Take I-75 north to McKinney, exit at Virginia Pkwy. Turn left (west) and drive 5.5 miles to Custer Rd. (FM 2478); turn left (south) for ½ mile, course entrance on right.

Aug 26 Luna Vista (Dallas) 214-670-6322; 11223 Luna Rd. Drive to I-35E (Stemmons Frwy). Exit at Royal Lane. Drive west 1.1 miles (traffic light). Turn left (Luna Rd.), drive .4 mile, course entrance on right

Sept 2 <u>Hurricane Creek C.C.</u> (Anna) 972-924-3247; 1800 Fairway Lane. Take I-75 (Central Expwy) north, exit at Anna (Truck Stop), turn left go over I-75, right turn onto the west service road. Caution: Yield to traffic exiting I-75. Drive 1.7 miles (north). Left turn at small sign, leads to club.

2015 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP

This year's Open Championship was played at St. Andrews, Scotland. The hottest golfer on the planet was Dallas' own, Jordan Spieth who would attempt to win his 3rd major tournament in a row. For that reason he was removed from the selection board for this tournament, however, all NTSGA golfers secretly hoped he would win. The overall favorite of the 94 NTSGA players competing in this year's pool were Dustin Johnson, Justin Rose, Ricky Fowler, Adam Scott, Henrik Stenson and Louis Oosthuizen.

The tournament began on Thursday under cold, windy conditions. Jordan Spieth set the early pace by making birdie in 5 of the first 7 holes. Dustin Johnson who was bombing 331 yd drives off the tee was the tournament leader by 1 stroke over 6 other golfers. Jordan Spieth trailed by 2 strokes.

Day 2 began on time, but was halted for 3 hours due to torrential rains over the entire course. Forty two players did not finish their rounds and would tee off early Saturday morning to complete their 2nd round. It appeared that even par would be the cut line before the players began Round 3.

The Saturday round got started, but didn't last long as the R & A stopped play when 40 mph winds whipped across the golf course. This delay lasted for 10 hours. The late afternoon weather turned beautiful with blue skies and sunshine and allowed players to complete the 2nd round. The rain and wind delay on both Friday and Saturday would result now in a Monday finish to the 144th Open Championship. Dustin Johnson would still lead the field by 1 stroke beginning the 3rd round, but NTSGA golfers were encouraged as 1 or both of their players were only a few strokes off the lead including Adam Scott, Jason Day, Zach Johnson, Hideki Matsuyama and Louis Oosthuizen.

The 3rd round of the Open Championship started under almost benign weather conditions compared to the first 2 days. Overcast skies with little wind accounted for great shots with as many as 8 players bunched at the top of the leaderboard. Jordan Spieth vaulted to the top making 7 birdies during his round. At the end of Day 3, amateur Paul Dunne found himself tied for the tournament lead with veteran's Jason Day and Louis Oosthuizen. Dustin Johnson faded to 18th position. Jordan Spieth was 1 shot off the pace after recording a 66.

The final round began under calm conditions which gave way to rain later in the day. The lead changed almost every 5 minutes with Jason Day, Luis Oosthuizen, Jordan Spieth, Zach Johnson and Mark Leishman all jockeying for position. At one point in the day, Phil Mickelson was only 2 shots off the lead providing excitement to the 9 NTSGA members who selected him as ½ of their selection combo. At the end, 3 golfers were tied and would play a 4 hole playoff for the Claret jug. Jordan Spieth came up one shot short of the playoff. Zach Johnson prevailed in the playoff and won the title by 1 stroke over Louis Oosthuizen and Mark Leishman. **Roger Ball, Joe Thompson, Dick Hall** and **Gerald Gotcher** had all picked Zach Johnson, but none had him paired with the winning combination. Runner- up to this year's Open Championship Pot was **Joe Bob Wheeler** selecting Jason Day (T4) and Justin Rose (T6). The winners, splitting the \$470.00 pot were **Stan Robertson** and **Jay Houston** each selecting Louis Oosthuizen (T1) and Justin Rose (T6). The final major pot of the year will be for the PGA Championship, Aug.13-16 at Whistling Straits. Selections may be made at The Tribute on Aug. 12. Jordan Spieth will once again be off the board for this major tournament.
