NTSGA RULES REFRESHER.....IMPROVING YOUR LIE

You may use the longest club in your bag to improve your lie up to <u>1</u> club length, no closer to the hole. You cannot use your club, foot or hands to build a lie by roughing or raising the turf or mashing down the turf behind the ball. You cannot improve your lie in a hazard, however, you may now touch the ground and remove loose impediments from a hazard (USGA 2019 rules change) .You may play a ball from a hazard, as it lies, or lift the ball from the hazard and drop within 2 club lengths from the hazard line where the ball entered the hazard, incurring a <u>1 stroke</u> penalty. Or, you may drop the ball anywhere on the extended line from where the ball entered the hazard back to the area where you struck your last shot, also incurring a <u>1 stroke</u> penalty.

DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES

Nov. 2 <u>Buffalo Creek</u> (Heath) 972-771-4003; 624 Country Club Dr. Drive the George Bush Turnpike east/south (it ends at I-30). Merge onto I-30 <u>east</u>. Go across lake, exit at Horizon Rd. Turn right, drive across Ridge Rd. (traffic light). Immediately past hospital, turn right onto Tubbs Rd. (7-11 store on left). Road changes name to White Rd. Wind through residential area paralleling golf course. At the stop sign (Country Club Rd.) turn left. Drive ¼ mile, course entrance on right.

Nov. 3 <u>Bridlewood</u> (Flower Mound) 972-355-4800; 4000 W. Windsor Dr. Proceed north on I-35E, exit at FM1171/Main St. (Lewisville). Turn left (west), drive 5 ½ miles, right turn at Bridlewood Blvd. At 1st stop sign, turn right, course entrance on left.

Nov. 10 <u>Woodbridge</u> (Wylie) 972-429-5100 7400 Country Club Dr. Drive the Geo Bush Turnpike, exit at Hwy 78 (north) in Garland. Drive 3.9 miles; turn right into the Woodbridge subdivision. At 2nd stop sign, turn left. Course entrance .2 miles, straight ahead.

Nov. 17 <u>Tierra Verde</u> (Arlington) 817-478-8500; 7005 Golf Club Dr. Take I-20 west past Hwy 360, turn south on Hwy 287 towards Mansfield for approx. 2½ miles, exit at Eden Road (2nd exit south of I-20). At stop sign turn right for ½ mile. Left turn at entrance to Martin Luther King Sports Center. Second driveway on left leads into clubhouse.



NTSGA RULES REFRESHER....PUTTING

A coin or flat object should be placed directly behind the ball before it is picked up and cleaned. If necessary to move the marker because it rests in another golfers putting line, the club head distance is taken from the marker, not the ball. Remember to replace the moved marker before setting the ball back on the green. The one club rule cannot be used to move the ball from the fringe/rough onto the putting surface. All putts <u>must</u> be holed out. There are no gimme putts. If you pick up and do not complete a hole, you have effectively withdrawn from the round and are ineligible to win prize money, skins or closest to the pin payouts.
