DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES:

Oct. 6 <u>Woodbridge</u> (Wylie) 972-429-5100 7400 Country Club Dr. Drive the Geo Bush Turnpike, exit at Hwy 78 (north) in Garland. Drive 3.9 miles; turn right into the Woodbridge subdivision. At 2nd stop sign, turn left. Course entrance .2 miles, straight ahead.

Oct. 13 <u>Heritage Ranch</u> (Fairview) 972-549-0276; 465 Scenic Ranch Circle. Take US-75 (Central Expwy) north, exit at Stacy Rd., right turn (east) 3 miles to the dead end (FM 1378). Turn left then an immediate right, back onto Stacy Rd. Continue east for ½ mile, course entrance on left (gated community with guard shack).

Oct. 20 <u>Waterchase</u> (Arlington) 817-861-4653; 8951 Creek Run Rd. Take I-30 westbound, past the Rangers Ballpark, exit at Eastchase Pkwy., right turn to 2nd traffic light. (John T. White Rd.) Turn right for 1 block. Right turn at Randol Mill Rd., drive ½ mile, left turn at Creek Run Rd., (alongside apt. complex), course ½ mile on left.

Oct. 27 <u>Texas Rangers</u> (Arlington) 817-275-5941; 801 Brown Blvd. Drive the George Bush Turnpike south, towards Arlington. Exit west at I-30 (towards Ft. Worth). Drive 3.2 miles, exit at Collins St. (Hwy 157). At traffic light, turn right, drive 1 mile. Left turn at Brown Blvd. Course entrance on right. <u>Or</u>, drive the George Bush Turnpike south towards Arlington. Exit at Hwy 183 (towards Ft. Worth). Drive 1.8 miles and take Hwy 360 south. Drive 4 miles and exit at Brown Blvd /Ave J. Turn right and drive 1.9 miles (road is hilly) to Collins St. Go across Collins, course entrance on right.

LATE CANCELLATIONS...

Late cancellations cause much frustration for Tournament Chairman **Rod Wells**. A late cancellation is anytime after the 12:00 noon sign up deadline, 2 days before a tournament. (Usually 12:00 noon, Monday). After that time he puts together the pairing sheet for the upcoming event. A late cancellation creates the necessity to move a player(s) to another group, change cart assignments, all while trying to keep players with similar handicaps together. He understands that emergencies arise and sometimes a late cancellation cannot be avoided, but it would help immensely if he knows of a cancellation well before the signup deadline. Most of the time, the golf course's charge us for the number of players participating at an event. However, some courses charge NTSGA for a full field (128) since that's the number we said would participate months in advance. At a recent Board meeting, the Board voted 9-0 in favor of assessing the member the green fee/cart fee for a late cancellation, if the course charges NTSGA for a no-show.
