## **DIRECTIONS TO GOLF COURSES**

July 2 <u>Grapevine</u> (Grapevine) 817-410-3377; Drive west on LBJ freeway (I-635) towards DFW airport. Prior to the airport entry, exit at Bass Pro Dr., continue to the traffic light. Turn left, drive over Hwy 121, past the Embassy Suites Hotel to the next traffic light (Hwy 26). Turn left, drive ½ mile to next traffic light, turn right (Fairway Dr.) Drive past Cowboys Golf Club and over the Lake Grapevine Dam. On the other side of the Dam, turn right into golf course entrance.

July 9 Sky Creek Ranch (Keller) 817-498-1414; 600 Promontory Dr. Drive LBJ Frwy towards DFW Airport, take Hwy 121 south (it goes south for ½ mile, and then turns west). At the Hwy 121/114 split, bear right towards Bridgeport, exit at Southlake Blvd. Turn left, drive 4.9 miles. Left turn at Randol Mill (Dunkin' Donuts on left, Shell station on right). Randol Mill turns into Davis Blvd in a few blocks. Drive .9 miles to 2<sup>nd</sup> traffic light. Right turn at Bear Creek Pkwy. Drive 1.4 miles through residential area. Watch for small sign to Sky Creek Ranch. Right turn at Promontory Dr., leads to club.

July 16 <u>Bridlewood</u> (Flower Mound) 972-355-4800; 4000 W. Windsor Dr. Proceed north on I-35E, exit at FM1171/Main St. (Lewisville). Turn left (west), drive 5 ½ miles, right turn at Bridlewood Blvd. At 1<sup>st</sup> stop sign, turn right, course entrance on left.

July 23 <u>Tangleridge</u> (Grand Prairie) 972-299-6837; 818 Tangle Ridge Dr. Take I-35E south thru downtown Dallas. Bear right at the Hwy 67 split, towards Cleburne. After passing under I-20, drive 8.7 miles, exit at Lake Ridge Pkwy., right turn, drive 2 miles. Turn left at Park Ridge Dr. (traffic light), follow signs through residential area for approx. 1.2 miles to golf course entrance. Or, drive south on the George Bush Turnpike through Arlington towards I-20. Exit at Lake Ridge Parkway (the exit before I-20) and continue south for approximately 8.5 miles. After crossing 2nd bridge, drive .8 mile turning right at the traffic light to enter the Tangleridge residential area. Drive approx. 1.2 miles (go past elementary school). Turn right at Park Ridge Ct. Leads to golf course.

July 30 <u>Waterchase</u> (Arlington) 817-861-4653; 8951 Creek Run Rd. Take I-30 westbound, past the Rangers Ballpark and Cowboys stadium locations. Exit at Eastchase Pkwy., right turn to 2<sup>nd</sup> traffic light. (John T. White Rd.) Turn right for 1 block. Right turn at Randol Mill Rd., drive ¼ mile, left turn at Creek Run Rd., (alongside apt. complex), course ½ mile on left.

### **US OPEN POT...**

The USGA decided to make this year's US Open golf course (Oakmont Country Club) the toughest of any major championship. The course located just outside of Pittsburgh, PA could test every aspect of the pro's game. The rough looked like uncut hay, the greens resembling plate glass windows and the overall length, measuring 7372 yards. Because of Scottie Scheffler's superlative record so far in 2025, he was



removed from the field of contention for the NTSGA Pool. The most popular selections made by NTSGA members were Bryson DeChambeau, Rory McIlroy, Colin Morikawa, John Rahm and Xander Schauffele. Unheralded J.J. Spaun lead after the first round followed closely by Sungjae Im, Brooks Koepka and Si Woo Kim. This was only the second US Open played by J.J. Spaun.

Round 2 got underway with the same punishment as Day 1 as many favorites to contend in this year's tournament, missed the cut. Not playing on the weekend included NTSGA member's favorites: Bryson DeChambeau, Ludvig Aberg, Tommy Fleetwood, Shane Lowry and Justin Thomas. Of the 77 NTSGA member's selections, 53 got knocked out of contention as the golf course bested many of the combo selections sending favorite golfers home early.

Round 3 started with Sam Burns leading, followed by J.J. Spaun, Viktor Hovland, Adam Scott and Ben Griffin. The worlds' best players tried to hit balls into fairways and away from the menacing rough and large, deep bunkers. Playing in the rain for a few holes, the pro's completed their rounds still with the same golfers as US Open contenders. Sam Burns continued to lead and NTSGA member's **Roger Legge, Jalil Daneshfar** and **Bruce Mayberry** were hoping they had paired the correct combo selection with Burns to win the 2025 US Open Pot.

Round 4 began with Sam Burns leading under cloudy skies. JJ Spaun seemingly ended his victory hopes when he bogeyed the first 5 holes of the final round. Veteran Adam Scott, playing in his 96<sup>th</sup> consecutive major tournament took the lead shortly, until rain forced stoppage of play. After the rain, the pros found the fairways wet, golf balls containing clumps of mud and unable to escape shots from the long, wet rough. J.J. Spaun kept inching his way back up the leaderboard and sealed his victory with a 65' curving downhill putt on the 72<sup>nd</sup> hole in front of thousands of attendees in the club boxes and surrounding the 18<sup>th</sup> green. The winner of the NTSGA 2025 US Open Pot was Jalil Daneshfar selecting Sam Burns & Jon Rahm, pocketing \$231.00. Second place won by Joe Ben Ramos, earning \$96.00 with his Jon Rahm/ Xander Schauffele selection. Third place tie went to Roger Ball (Jon Rahm/Ryan Fox), Bruce Mayberry (Sam Burns/Rory McIlroy) and Steve Menzies (Jon Rahm/Rory McIlroy) all pocketing \$19.00.

The next major Championship Pot will be open for selections on July 16 at Bridlewood for the 2025 British Open being played at Royal Portrush, Northern Ireland, July 17-20.

It is the 2<sup>nd</sup> Hole-in-One made by Stu during his golfing career.



### **CTP MARKERS:**

The **6B** foursome at Tour 18 neglected to pick up the Closest to the Pin marker from Hole #5. When this happens, it delays entering the results by the Scoring Committee into the computer and further delays the results published for all members to view on the website. If you are the last foursome to play a par 3 hole...BRING THE MARKER TO THE SCORING COMMITTEE. There is a reminder on the scorecards (in yellow/red ink) to alert the foursome that they must bring the CTP marker off the course. The message reminder states: P/U CTP on 5. The hole par number is also printed in yellow and each golfer has a yellow asterisk aside their name where the score for that hole will be entered, also as a reminder.

## PROMPTNESS...

Members should arrive at the golf course at least 45 minutes before the start time. This should be ample time to unload your golf clubs and check-in with the Tournament Chairman before the closing of the Check-in process. Remember the check-in process ends ½ hour before our 8:00 start time. This gives the Skins Coordinators, 2-man team Coordinator and Tournament Chairman time to close the check-in process, make necessary announcements, gather clubs from their automobiles and prepare to leave the staging area on time. Even if you electronically check-in/pay on line, please still check-in with the Tournament Chairman so he has an accurate player count when paying the golf course for our round. Thank you.
